Art of Music, especially the music of the
Church have sustained in his lamented
departure from this life.

It was reported that the College was represented
at the funeral by Dr Hunt, Dr Vincent, Mr. Fox-Davies
and Dr A. H. Mann, and that a wreath had
been sent.

(1) A letter dated August 12, 1877 from Mr. Secretary Gross, Secretary of State for the Home Department, was read, in which he expressed the late Queen's "good wishes for the success of the undertaking" while Her Majesty regretted that she was unable to accept the position of visitor to the College. (2) A letter from Dr. Edward Grieg dated Copenhagen February 1001, was read in which he accepted Honorary Fellowship of the College.

(3) The local secretary of Lismore had been informed of the abolition of the Centre as at present constituted, and the head of the Convention there had also been written to, but the address in London of the Bishop of Grafton had not been ascertained.

(4) A printed copy of the regulations for the Travelling Musical Scholarship established by the Brisbane Centre which had been brought by Mr. Foster was laid on the table.
